- We continue to work towards our target of being active for 60 minutes every day, with 30 minutes occurring in school.
- In PE, Early Years have been dancing to a Frozen theme- creating ice palaces and shooting icicles. They have danced in unison as a whole class as well as in partners and on their own. We filmed and watched back our performance as well as showing our class teachers. Some lovely dancers.
- KS1 have been applying their catching and throwing skills to mini games including using different sized balls including rugby balls. In gymnastics, they have been developing strength and balance by using the large gymnastic equipment. The children have been so proud of themselves when they have jumped from the high platforms or performed different rolls.
- LKS2 have been orienteeringbuilding up simple symbol and map reading skills along with team work.
- UKS2 has tried something new-Yoga. Beth, a trained yoga teacher from the SSP, has come in and delivered 6 sessions over the term. It was something totally different to what we normally do in PE.

We learnt how stretching can help strengthen our muscles while helping our balance and coordination. Beth had some fun games as well as teaching us about breathing techniques to bring a little calm to our busy days.
