What I Wish My Parents or Carers knew ...

The governments' Children's Commissioner, Rachel D'Souza, has always been very strong on the risks of our digital and online world. To this end, she has recently published a document called 'What I Wish my Parents or Carers knew ...'. The research for this has involved children and young people and has been designed to make those difficult conversations about difficult decisions a bit easier, a bit more regular and a bit more effective.

The guide addresses issues such as setting boundaries, talking about harmful content, building on-going conversations and giving practical advice supported by young people. One young person said to parent, 'Don't be afraid to be firm ... If you are worried your child is seeing harmful content and you don't know what they're watching and it's affecting their behaviour, just take it that you know best, they don't.' That is quite a powerful and telling statement that our young people need, and even want, our support.
